INCLUSIVE HUBS

A whole school approach to transform schools into Inclusive Hub

The **Inclusive Hubs** project will contribute to those efforts through developing materials and tools focused upon wellbeing, inclusion, mental health, and personal development. Through the project implementation, the partnership will support holistic approaches to teaching and learning as well as collaboration among all actors relevant to schools (school staff, communities, migrant learners and their families) to transform schools into inclusive hubs. The partnership comprises of 6 partners from 4 european countries.



According to the **European Commission**, low proficiency and early school leaving can be a result of the struggle in learning and social exclusion, a phenomenon faced by many European areas.

Several European Union (EU) countries have already developed national strategies to facilitate stronger communication between schools and local communities, and provide measures to foster inclusion.

The project aims to help make schools a place for inclusion where all learners feel welcome, respected and valued, particularly those with fewer opportunities like migrants.



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
