PR1. GOOD PRACTICE GUIDE

In the project's partner countries - Romania, Greece, Lithuania, Cyprus, Ireland and Spain - a study has been carried out on the key competences and life skills that young offenders lack and which would significantly increase their employability.

PR2. E-COURSE ON SOFT-SKILLS

It includes the following modules:

- 1) communication;
- 2) teamwork;
- 3) work ethic;
- 4) critical thinking;
- 5) leadership;
- 6) positive attitude;
- 7) self-awareness;
- 8) planning and organizational skills;
- 9) practical skills.

The E-course has been tested in detention centres in the consortium countries, including with vulnerable young people.



PR3. AWARENESS RAISING TOOLKIT & TRAINING GUIDE

It is the awareness raising and policy toolkit for CSOs and youth organisations related to child offenders.

It includes sections:

E-Course Guidance: provides trainers with instructions on how to create interactive and multimedia-rich online modules that will increase learner engagement.

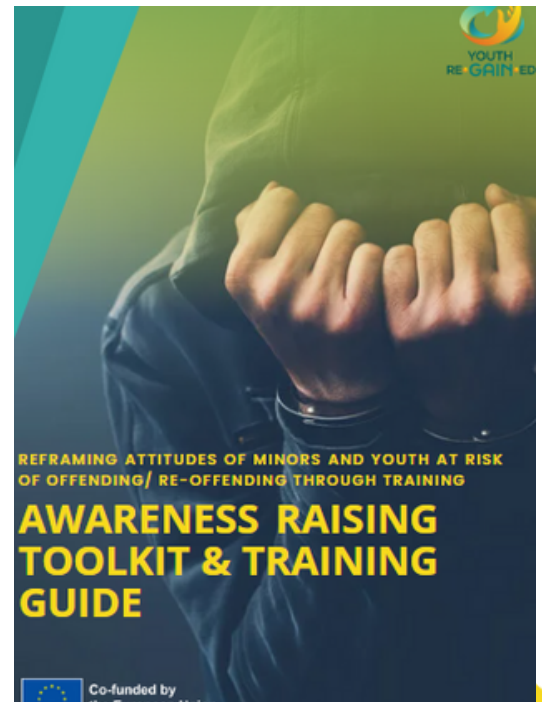
Evaluation & Social Media Checklists: offers practical tools for assessing the effectiveness of training programs and social media campaigns.
