HISTORY BOX MICRO LEARNING UNITS

Was the Spanish queen Juana the Mad really mad? Why does a country as small as Austria have so many old palaces all around its capital? And what's so special about Sweden joining NATO? In the second work package of The History BOX, the project consortium is developing micro learning units that explain aspects of the history of the partner countries in an engaging and interesting way. Our goal is to make it easier for newcomers to a country to understand the society they are becoming a part of - by learning about its past. We want our micro learning units to be informative, and at the same time easy to digest and even entertaining.

Together with historians, we identified the 10 most significant periods, events, and persons in the history of each partner country. We researched them and now work on sharing what we found out about them with educators, migrants and anyone who is interested. The 50 micro learning units will be made up of easy to read texts, images, and additional resources like ideas for activities or where to find out more about a topic. The results will be available for educators to use in their courses, and for everyone on the History Box learning platform.
