
### HISTORY BOX TRANSNATIONAL WORKSHOPS

In February 2023, we gathered online to explore "The Importance of History Education in the Integration Process." Participants from various European countries shared insights on how history education fits into their integration frameworks. Historians and professionals in adult education and integration enriched our discussions with their expertise.

We examined current practices and initiatives, and identified gaps. Also, we caried out a collaborative

exercise to pinpoint areas needing improvement and explored intercultural education and other pedagogical methods to enhance integration. The camaraderie and shared passion made these sessions inspiring, paving the way for more inclusive and effective integration practices through history education.





## PRACTICAL GUIDELINES FOR ADULT EDUCATORS


The practical guidelines aim to facilitate professionals in adult education to understand and raise awareness on the importance of the inclusion of history education in the integration courses available for immigrants and refugees, as well as to provide them with practical tips and guidance on teaching history in an impactful and interesting manner.

The guidelines consist of an overview of the integration status of immigrants and refugees in the project countries, the role of the civil society sector in the integration process, and practical considerations for the inclusion of history education in integration courses.

### **POLICY PAPER**

With the aim of raising awareness among target groups and stakeholders of the importance of teaching history to migrants and refugees, we published the policy paper in April 2024.

This document is based on the main findings of the national research reports from the first phase of the project. It contains information on the state of integration of migrants and refugees in the partner countries, the context of their integration, as well as the legal framework of these countries regarding the integration of migrants and the integration facilities and programmes provided by the state. In addition, the project partners explored how history can positively influence the integration process and collected examples of good practice in European countries. Based on these findings, we developed recommendations for teaching history in the context of integration. The results are summarised in the Policy Paper, published in English, Spanish, Italian, French and Swedish and available on the project website.
