18:00 – 19:00 **“Our Stories, Our Connection” A Conversation on Belonging, Inclusion & Resilience**

What makes a place feel like home? How do communities create spaces where everyone can belong, participate and flourish?

This interactive conversation brings together members of migrant and refugee communities, civil society actors and professionals working to strengthen inclusion and social cohesion. Through personal stories, shared experiences and open dialogue, participants will explore the human dimensions of integration, moving beyond systems and structures to focus on the relationships, encounters and everyday acts that help build stronger communities.

At the heart of the discussion lies the belief that inclusion is not a destination, but an ongoing collective process—one that is shaped by empathy, participation and mutual understanding. By creating space for diverse voices to be heard, the session seeks to highlight the experiences, contributions and aspirations of people whose stories enrich the social fabric of our communities.

Together, we will reflect on the role of local communities, municipalities, youth and civil society in fostering belonging, while exploring storytelling as a powerful catalyst for visibility, dialogue and connection.

Join us for an inspiring exchange of perspectives and experiences that celebrates diversity, strengthens community bonds and reimagines what it means to belong.

19:10 – 20:00 **“Roots and Routes” - Interactive Storytelling Workshop for Youth**

This participatory workshop invites young people from diverse backgrounds to explore questions of identity, intercultural dialogue, belonging, courage, and personal development through creative storytelling expression.

Utilising the framework “I am from... I am becoming,” participants will be encouraged to express themselves and share their journeys in the language and format they feel most comfortable with, creating a collective space for reflection, active listening, and exchange. Through writing, dialogue, and creative interaction, the workshop aims to foster empathy, peer-to-peer connection, and community-building among participants while empowering young people to tell their own stories in authentic and meaningful ways.

20:00 – 21:00 **Celebrating Community Voices: Live Performance by ANASA drummers (Anasa Cultural Center)**

In a collaborative and welcoming atmosphere, participants will have the opportunity to connect through live music, food, artistic expression and informal exchange, embracing diversity and cultural heritage as powerful drivers for community-building and, coexistence. Music contributions are organised in collaboration with the ANASA Cultural Centre, whose work highlights the transformative role of culture in fostering participation, belonging, and intercultural dialogue, while empowering individuals and communities through creative engagement and collective expression.
