Participants had the opportunity to explore key project findings, practical tools and approaches, while discussing issues such as Gender Equality Plans, structural and cultural barriers, stereotypes, inclusive institutional practices and the role of students as active agents of change.

More than dissemination activities, the National Multiplier Events became spaces for connection, reflection and collaboration. A strong example of this was the University of Macerata, which embedded the presentation and discussion of PRO-GENDERING results within the broader academic seminar “Gender Perspectives: Educating, Narrating, Participating”, held on 20 May 2026. By linking the project’s outcomes to a wider academic event, the initiative expanded the reach of the discussion and strengthened the visibility of PRO-GENDERING among diverse members of the academic community. This dynamic exchange encouraged participants to reflect on how gender equality can move beyond formal commitments and become part of meaningful and sustainable institutional change.
