

AccessCareer Advances Towards Piloting: Expert Collaboration and Guidance Tools Take Shape



As part of its ongoing work, the **AccessCareer partnership** has moved into a new phase of **collaborative development**, bringing together career counsellors, HR professionals, and socio-professional organisations from across Europe to deepen the project's insights and shape practical tools for socially disadvantaged individuals.

The consortium has formed an **Expert Working Group** uniting professionals from all partner countries into a shared, cross-border knowledge base. As part of this process, an **interactive International World Café session** brought partners together around five key discussion areas: inclusive career counselling practices, employment barriers, labour market trends and equity, useful resources and tools, and networks for inclusion. Each partner country subsequently hosted a **national roundtable**, conducted in the local language, to explore these themes within their national context.

In a parallel workstream, the consortium has developed **10 concrete guidance tools** designed to support socially disadvantaged individuals in navigating and entering the labour market. The tools were led by Mylia, with contributions from all partners to ensure their relevance and applicability across different national contexts.

In addition, the consortium has begun drafting **policy recommendations**, which aim to support more inclusive, evidence-based career counselling practices at national and European level.
