The AccessCareer project

continues its journey to strengthen career counselling across Europe and empower socially disadvantaged individuals to take charge of their career paths. Having built a strong training foundation and gathered rich insights from the field, we are now entering an exciting new phase: piloting our tools and translating our findings into policy recommendations.

The Expert Working Group & World Café

Following our collaborative phase with career counsellors, HR professionals, and socio-professional organisations across all partner countries, the Expert Working Group has taken shape into a genuine cross-border knowledge base.

The International World Café brought partners together around five key discussion tables; covering inclusive counselling practices, employment barriers, labour market trends and equity, useful resources and tools, and building networks for inclusion. Each table generated rich, practice-based insights that are now directly informing our next steps.

Following the World Café, each partner country hosted its own national roundtable, bringing the same key themes down to a local level and in each partner's own language. These sessions allowed contributing stakeholders to explore the realities of their national labour markets in greater depth, building directly on the insights gathered at the transnational level.

To round off this phase, an expert panel coordinated by Acción Laboral will bring together one expert per partner country to discuss labour market trends, equity, and inclusion into a transnational perspective.

Guidance Tools for Job Seekers

Building on everything gathered through the working group and World Café, Mylia led the development of practical guidance tools. The selection and contextualisation of the resources were informed by the professional expertise, practical experience, and insights shared by practitioners working with disadvantaged individuals across the partner countries.

This close correspondence between national experts and tool developers means the final set of 10 guidance resources reflects both a shared European vision and the practical, on-the-ground realities faced by career counsellors and jobseekers across Belgium, Greece, Spain, Italy, and Cyprus.

Looking Ahead: Policy Recommendations

We are now moving from design to real-world testing. Alongside our guidance tools, the partnership has begun to translate everything we've learned so far into a set of policy recommendations. These will aim to support more inclusive, evidence-based career counselling practices at national and European level, ensuring the impact of AccessCareer extends well beyond the life of the project.



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
